LIFE THOUGHTS

"Watchmen" are to call wrong things wrong (Ezekiel 33:7-9). Labeling a wrong thing political or controversial and not talking about it within the Church does not make it any less wrong. And why wouldn't watchmen want to call wrong things wrong? Doing so then gives opportunity to share what God, in Christ, has done about wrong things.

AS WE GATHER

The natural catastrophes by a hurricane in New Orleans a number of years ago and now the earthquakes in Haiti and Chile have shown that the majority of Americans think that these things are the exception, rather than something that will always occur. How can I say this? What proof have I? . . . It's the way in which we have responded. We really don't have in place an effective emergency plan for major natural catastrophes. We really do believe that they are the exception to what happens. Given that we live in a Fallen World and given that these things do occur because we do live in a Fallen World, we should have an effective and efficient plan to take care of such emergencies. Instead, what do we do after a catastrophe occurs? Point the finger of blame at what we perceive is either the cause of the catastrophe or who didn't respond according to American standards.

The common thinking in Jesus' day, too, was to figure out the cause of why 18 were killed when the tower at Siloam fell. Were those 18 guiltier than those who did not die? Jesus changes this perspective when He says, "This happened to bring about the softened heart of repentant people." Repentant people can see in major catastrophes the gracious hand of the Lord. May your worship today help you sense the graciousness of our Lord when bad things occur.

PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP

O Lord God, whose ways are beyond our understanding, we confess that we do not understand why the earthquake hit the devastated country of Haiti, nor do we understand why a powerful hurricane struck the city of New Orleans a number of years ago. During this service convince us again that your gracious ways are more profound and more prevalent than all the catastrophes of our Fallen World, through Jesus Christ, Your great gift of salvation for us. Amen.

For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ. ⁵Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness.
