P: Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.




Silence to reflect on your need for a Savior.














THIS IS THE FEAST

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Nehemiah 9:1-21

Now on the twenty-fourth day of this month the people of Israel were assembled with fasting and in sackcloth, and with earth on their heads. And the Israelites separated themselves from all foreigners and stood and confessed their sins and the iniquities of their fathers. And they stood up in their place and read from the Book of the Law of the LORD their God for a quarter of the day; for another quarter of it they made confession and worshiped the LORD their God. On the stairs of the Levites stood Jeshua, Bani, Kadmiel, Shebaniah, Bunni, Sherebiah, Bani, and Chenani; and they cried with a loud voice to the LORD their God. Then the Levites, Jeshua, Kadmiel, Bani, Hashabneiah, Sherebiah, Hodiah, Shebaniah, and Pethahiah, said, "Stand up and bless the LORD your God from everlasting to everlasting. Blessed be your glorious name, which is exalted above all blessing and praise.

"You are the LORD, you alone. You have made heaven, the heaven of heavens, with all their host, the earth and all that is on it, the seas and all that is in them; and you preserve all of them; and the host of heaven worships you. You are the LORD, the God who chose Abram and brought

him out of Ur of the Chaldeans and gave him the name Abraham. You found his heart faithful before you, and made with him the covenant to give to his offspring the land of the Canaanite, the Hittite, the Amorite, the Perizzite, the Jebusite, and the Girgashite. And you have kept your promise, for you are righteous.

"And you saw the affliction of our fathers in Egypt and heard their cry at the Red Sea, and performed signs and wonders against Pharaoh and all his servants and all the people of his land, for you knew that they acted arrogantly against our fathers. And you made a name for yourself, as it is to this day. And you divided the sea before them, so that they went through the midst of the sea on dry land, and you cast their pursuers into the depths, as a stone into mighty waters. By a pillar of cloud you led them in the day, and by a pillar of fire in the night to light for them the way in which they should go. You came down on Mount Sinai and spoke with them from heaven and gave them right rules and true laws, good statutes and commandments, and you made holy Sabbath and commanded them vour commandments and statutes and a law by Moses your servant. You gave them bread from heaven for their hunger and brought water for them out of the rock for their thirst, and you told them to go in to possess the land that you had sworn to give them.

"But they and our fathers acted presumptuously and stiffened their neck and did not obey your commandments. They refused to obey and were not mindful of the wonders that you performed among them, but they stiffened their neck and appointed a leader to return to their slavery in Egypt. But you are a God ready to forgive, gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and did not forsake them. Even when they had made for themselves a golden calf and said, 'This is your God who brought you up out of Egypt,' and had committed great blasphemies, you in your great mercies did not forsake them in the wilderness. The pillar of cloud to lead them in the way did not depart from them by day, nor the pillar of fire by night to light for them the way by which they should go. You gave your good Spirit to instruct them and did not withhold your manna from their mouth and gave them water for their thirst. Forty years you sustained them in the wilderness, and they lacked nothing. Their clothes did not wear out and their feet did not swell.

Ten years ago when we first started this we had been sidewalk counseling for two days and no one was noticing much. Third day . . .

Across the leafy sidewalk, a young high school girl stepped out of a bus and fearfully walked towards the looming abortion building. She responded to my friendly greeting and stopped to talk. I quickly learned that her name was Jada, and she had skipped class with her friend <u>to hide an abortion from her parents.</u>

Jada learned we had something she desperately needed - HOPE.

She accepted my offer of help, and we walked together a couple blocks up to the nearest pregnancy resource center. As we continued, Jada's eyes filled with tears as her terror and fears began to evaporate.

lada was the first Turnaround in our ministry.

On that fateful Wednesday <u>5 more women</u> followed suit and left the abortion facility. We were so grateful then that we had followed God's call to stand in the gap for these women and children hour after hour. Today we don't just celebrate the 10th Birthday of Coalition for Life of St. Louis. We celebrate the **3,000 women** who have turned around with our sidewalk counselors to pursue life instead of death.

Jada's child, along with all the children saved that first year, is now in 5th grade.
