

#### CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION


L: Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.



who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified,


who spoke by the prophets.



P: As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes. C: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.


#### LORD'S PRAYER







