We are excited about all to come in the Pre-K classes, and we're happy to tell our parents what we've learned each day.

In the Pre-K 3 classroom we are now able to identify letters K, L, M, N, O, and P with the help of our friends Kathy Kangaroo, Larry Lion, Mickey Monkey, Nicky Narwhal, Oscar Otter, and Penny Penguin. They've learned many interesting things about these letters like, Kitchen Safety, Listening, Manners, Neighbors, Opposites, and Pairs. Our focus numbers have been 9, 10, 11, and 12. We still enjoy our arts and craft Fridays, and hope you enjoy the artwork that your child has brought home. In our Bibles our focus scriptures have been Luke 8:50, Philippians 4:19, and Mark 10:14- 12:31.

In the Pre-K 4 classroom we have started reading books!! We're now familiar with our letters, sounds, and blends and are reading 3 word sentences. We've focused on Healthy Habits such as, washing our hands, eating healthy foods, brushing our teeth twice a day, drinking plenty of water, and getting plenty of rest. In Math Readiness we have number climbed all the way to the number 70! Our focus numbers are 12, 13, and 14. This month we have discovered a new black historian each day for Black History Month. Some of the people we've discussed are; Maya Angelou, Louis Armstrong, Garrett Morgan, and Dr. Patricia Bath. In our Bibles our focus

scriptures have been 1 John 4:19, Colossians 3:13, Matthew 19:14-11:29, and Psalm 123:3.

As we come to the close of Black History Month, I am excited to say that the Kindergarten class has learned many new things about the rich history that we come from. Each week we have learned something new about several influential African-Americans that have helped pave the way to help give us the equality that we deserve! We have learned to be thankful and grateful for everything they did for us because we know it was not an easy journey!

Not only have we learned new things about our history, but we also took our second field trip of the school year this month. The Pre-K and Kindergarten classes went to go and see The Magic School Bus "Lost in Space" at the James J Eagan Theater. It was an amazing experience to learn about the solar system in the most theatrical way! The students couldn't stop raving about all the different information they learned from the play.

In Reading, we are constantly working on our sight words and breaking words down to count the syllables. With the previous review of the letter sounds this year, it has been making it that much easier to sound out new

words. The children have had a great start to the beginning of reading process.

In Math, we have continued on with counting coins amongst many other things. The class was introduced to the dime and how many pennies it would take to equal a dime as well as counting by tens. Just this past week the class was introduced to addition! The class was extremely excited to learn this new skill! I can't wait to see how they soar into new heights with all the other new things they will be learning!

In Religion we have talked about stories that show what Jesus did after he chose his disciples. A lot of his work then was miraculous things. Their favorite story out of the unit that came from Luke 17: 11-19, "Jesus Heals Ten Men". Although after he healed those men only one came back to thank Him. As a class we talked about the Bible verse "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good" Psalm 107:1.
